FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

In the chapel of my alma mater, Westcott House Theological College, Cambridge, hangs an icon, written especially for the chapel, with the words "Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you". Generations of trainee clergy, passing through Westcott House, have spent countless hours in front of the 'Westcott Icon', in prayer and meditation.

The message is clear. We have been chosen - appointed to go out and bear fruit for the Kingdom. But that does not mean that we don't have our own choices to make. It does not mean that we are mere pawns being moved around on a chessboard.

Our choice is that we show up.

Our decision is to be involved, to throw ourselves into our faith by engaging with worship, by reading the bible, by praying, by volunteering, by living our lives in the service of others - by showing up - enable us in turn to be chosen, to be called, to be sent by God out into the world.

We are almost at the end of our Easter observances – week by week we have been walking with the disciples on a journey of re-discovery as Jesus appears to both them and to us, reminding us of his presence – truly and physically – in the world. And now, as we approach the Feast of the Ascension, the day when Jesus was taken up into heaven, we are now being encouraged to bear witness to that presence, and to live it out, to be Christ's presence, his very body in the world.



SECOND READING | 1 JOHN 5.1-12

Reader A reading from the first letter of John.

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth. There are three that testify: the Spirit and the water and the blood, and these three agree. If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.


BREAKING OF THE BREAD AND COMMUNION

We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your table. But you are the same Lord whose nature is always to have mercy. Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

The Presider and other ministers begin the distribution of communion. Please wait until you are invited forward by a welcomer.

All who desire a deeper relationship with God are welcome to receive communion here. Those who do not wish to receive communion are invited to come up for a blessing. Please cross your arms across your chest to indicate to the priest that you are asking for a blessing.

Gluten-free wafers are available - please indicate to the Presider. Please tell a welcomer or the Presider if you or someone you're with is unable to come up for communion and would like to receive it, or a blessing, in their pew.

The common cup is available - although certainly not mandatory. Do remember that receiving the bread alone is a complete act of communion with Christ.

Intinction (dipping) is not authorised in this Diocese.

Please exercise responsibility when it comes to the protection of your own health and that of those around you.
