FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

This Sunday is traditionally known as Passion Sunday. Though we now have our Passion reading on Palm Sunday (next week!) today still marks the point at which we start to focus our attention on what is to come. We have turned the corner from Mothering Sunday, and now our focus shifts to Passiontide.

Today in our Gospel reading we see the zenith of Jesus' earthly ministry, slap bang in the middle of the Gospel of John, with people clamouring to "see Jesus" - and the response points directly to what is to come - Jesus' death and resurrection. We join in with that desire to "see Jesus".

So perhaps it's a little odd, on the day we raise our voices in desire to 'see' this glory among us, that we begin to strip our churches, and veil our crosses and crucifixes - removing the very reminders of Jesus here in this place.

But there is method in the madness. We cover our symbols for these two weeks, so that we might more truly enter into the drama of Passiontide. The symbols act as reminders all year round - but for these two weeks we truly enter into the narrative and walk alongside Jesus.

There's so much going on in the life of the parish these two weeks - your challenge, should you choose to accept it, is to enter more fully into the Passion narrative by engaging fully with the liturgy. Walk with Christ this Holy Week - you won't regret it.
