FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

It was only a matter of time in our journey through the Christmas season, as we make sense of all that the incarnation means for us and our lives of faith, that we come across a call for 'repentance'. In modern parlance, the use of such language has become particularly strong. A call to 'repent' carries weight, and often even a sense of aggression. This is now the language of the street-corner preacher who proclaims the end of the world nigh, or the conservative bishops who call for 'repentance' from those with whom they disagree. When we hear such calls for 'repentance' we envisage it being from a position of assumed moral superiority – with a pointed finger and a strained relationship. Such is the power of language.

In this week's Gospel reading, Jesus calls his new followers to 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.' Are we to hear this call to repent in the same way?

Perhaps an examination of Jesus' actions as well as his words will help us come to a better understanding of the kind of 'repentance' Jesus is advocating. We hear the call of the disciples to leave their nets and follow Jesus, and we hear of the lives of 'the sick and those who were afflicted with various diseases and pains, demoniacs, epileptics, and paralytics' being transformed as they are healed.

This is true repentance in the ministry of Jesus – true to the original meaning of the word 'metanoia' in that lives are reoriented, transformed, turned around as the light of Christ dawns in the world. The 'good news' of Christmas is not that judgement has come among us, but that the love of God – all-encompassing, all-enveloping, all- inclusive – has been born in our midst and now dwells among us – works among us.

The Kingdom of Heaven truly has come near – and it looks like love and welcome, not like judgement and aggression.
